Tomato

Bradley is a disease resistant variety released in 1961 by Dr. Joe McFerran of the University of Arkansas. The seeds produce delicious, sweet tomatoes that are well balanced with just enough acidity to give you that old-fashioned big tomato flavor that you love so much.

VARIETY INFO

Botanical Name: *Lycopersicon esculentum* "Bradley"

Plant Dimensions: 18" - 36"

Days to Maturity: 60 - 90

Zone: 3 - 10

SOWING & GROWING

Sow Outside: Not recommended.

Start Inside: Planting in a growing tray for indoor start:

Fill each spot with soil leaving a quarter inch at the top.

Put 2-3 seeds per container then sprinkle soil on top.

Keep soil moist but not soaked. Once plants start

forming, more water can be applied. Keep in area that allows for plenty of sunlight and rotate regularly.

Transplant: Transplanting is best done 1 to 2 weeks after the average date of the last frost for your region.

Days to Emerge: 5 - 10 days

Seed Depth: 1/4" - 1/2"

Seed Spacing: 36"

Row Spacing: 4 to 6 feet

Thinning: Not necessary

HARVESTING INFO

Harvest: When the tomato is 1/2 green and 1/2 pink is when you can start harvesting your tomato. It will continue to ripen once picked. Keep in cool place to allow it to ripen without damaging the fruit or losing flavor or nutrients.

Fruit: 6 ounce with pink color.
