## **SOWING & GROWING**

Sow Outside: Not Recommended.

**Start Inside:** Plant in a growing tray 4 to 10 weeks before the last frost. Fill each spot with soil leaving a quarter inch at the top. Put 2-3 seeds per container then sprinkle soil on top. Keep soil moist but not soaked. Once plants start forming, more water can be applied. Keep in area that allows for plenty of sunlight and rotate regularly. Transplant 1 to 2 weeks after the average date

of the last frost for your region. **Days to Emerge:** 5–10 days

Seed Depth: 1/4-1/2"
Seed Spacing: 18-36"

Row Spacing: 2"

Thinning: Not necessary

# HARVESTING INFO

**Harvest:** When the tomato is 1/2 green and 1/2 pink is when you can start harvesting your tomato. It will continue to ripen once picked.

Fruit: 10 - 16 ounce fruit.
