Watermellon

Charleston Gray is a big, juicy, open-pollinated watermelon variety. Oblong watermelons are 24" long x 10" wide and weigh about 30 pounds. The flesh is bright red, fibreless, crisp, and the tough rind makes it a good shipper.

SOWING INFO

Sow Outside: Plant directly in the garden in early summer, when the weather is consistently warm and soil temperatures have reached 70 to 90 degrees F. Start Inside: In cool climates, start indoors, but no sooner than a month before transplanting. Plant three seeds per peat pot, 1/4" deep. Provide heat to keep the soil at least 80-85 degrees F. Days to Emerge: 8-10 days Seed Depth: 1" Seed Spacing: 18–36" Row Spacing: 4" to 6"

GROWING INFO

Harvesting: Pick when the rinds turn a dull shade of green and the part of the melon touching the soil, previously straw yellow to greenish white, turns creamy yellow. Cut melons from the vine with a sharp knife. Leave about an inch (2.5 cm.) of stem attached, unless you plan to use the melon immediately.

Fruit: The classic oblong watermelon, Charleston Gray has red, fiberless flesh and a tough, medium-thick gray-green rind.
