# **EVERGREEN BUNCHING**

## **Onions**

Grown exclusively as green bunching onions. Onions have white shanks and white skin making it a very attractive scallion for gourmet dishes. A hardy plant that can withstand cold weather. If you like scallions, you'll love this variety.

#### **VARIETY INFO**

**Botanical Name:** Allium fistulosum

Plant Dimensions: 12 - 16"

## **SOWING INFO**

**Sow Outside:** Sow three seeds per inch 1/4" deep in light, rich soil and full sun. Thin the seedlings 3" apart. Thinned onions can be transplanted or used for fresh eating.

**Start Inside:** Plant the seeds 1/4" deep in a flat 2-3 months before the last frost date; keep the soil moist and at room temperature. When the tops begin to flop over, cut them off to 3" to focus the growing on the roots. Four weeks before the last frost or when the soil reaches at least 50 degrees F, transplant the seedlings 3" apart in rows 12" apart.

Days to Emerge: 6-12 days

Seed Depth: 1/4"

Seed Spacing: 12-18"
Row Spacing: 1/4 - 3/4"

#### **GROWING INFO**

**Harvesting:** Harvesting can begin any time after plants have reached 4-6 inches high. The larger they get, the stronger the flavor will be! If pulling up entire plants, you may want to wait 4-5 months from seeding to harvest, until they reach full maturity.
