SOWING INFO

Sow Outside: RECOMMENDED. 4 to 6 weeks before your average last frost date, and when soil temperature is above 40°F, ideally 65°–85°F. Successive Sowings: Every 1 to 2 weeks until late spring. Sow again in late summer until 4 weeks before your average first fall frost date.

Start Inside: Not recommended; roots sensitive to disturbance.

Days to Emerge: 5–10 days Seed Depth: ½" Seed Spacing: 1" Row Spacing: 12" Thinning: When 1" tall, thin to 2" apart

GROWING INFO

Harvesting: Harvest when radish is no larger than 4"long and under 1" wide in diameter. If allowed to grow bigger, 'French Breakfast' may become pithy and hot.Fruit: Eye-catching red root with white tips.
