
MASAI Bush Lima

Masai is easy to grow, extremely popular French filet bean has an amazing flavor! The plants stay small making them great for small spaces. Despite their smaller size, they still produce tons of slender, juicy, and crisp beans. Holds longer on the bush, making it easier to keep up with the harvest. Disease resistant! Special Instructions: For fresh beans all summer, reseed beans every two weeks and harvest frequently.

Botanical Name: *Phaseolus vulgaris* Plant Dimensions: 12" – 14" Days to Maturity: 51 Zone: 3 – 9

SOWING INFO

Sow Outside: Lima beans cannot survive cold weather, so plant them well after the last frost when the soil temperature is at least 70 degrees. Plant heirloom Henderson bush lima bean seeds in a sunny location about 5" apart, "eye" side down, and 1" deep, in rows 24" to 36" apart. Germination may be slow. The soil should be enriched with compost or other organic matter, and deeply worked. After the last frost with soil temperatures above 60°F. Sow 2-3" apart. Start Inside: Not Recommended. Days to Emerge: 8 – 16 Days Seed Depth: 1" Seed Spacing: 4" – 6" Row Spacing: 2-3'

GROWING INFO

Harvesting: Before the seeds bulge and beans snap easily. Pick continually every 2-3 days to prolong production.

Fruit: Huge yields of thin, smooth and flavorful 4" bean.
