


# SLENDERETTE

## Bush Bean

'Slenderette' is an excellent variety to eat fresh, or as a processing variety either canned or frozen. It was bred by the Charter Seed Company of Twin Falls, Idaho and introduced in 1968.



## NOTES

### VARIETY INFO

**Botanical Name:** *Phaseolus vulgaris* 'Slenderette'

**Plant Dimensions:** 24"

**Days to Maturity:** 55

**Zone:** 3 - 9

### SOWING INFO

**Sow Outside:** After the last frost with soil temperatures above 60°F. sown directly after the final spring frost.

Sow 2-3 seeds 1" deep and 2-3" apart in moist, organically rich, well-drained soil with a pH of 6.0-6.8. Planting in soil under 60°F results in poor germination.

**Start Inside:** Not Recommended

**Days to Emerge:** 7 – 10 Days

**Seed Depth:** 1"

**Seed Spacing:** 4" – 6"

**Row Spacing:** 18" – 24"

**Thinning:** Not required.

### GROWING INFO

**Harvesting:** Beans should be picked while the pods still snap, and the beans have not filled the pod out completely. Beans get tough and stringy if allowed to grow too big.

**Fruit:** 5" long, 5-6 beans per pod.
