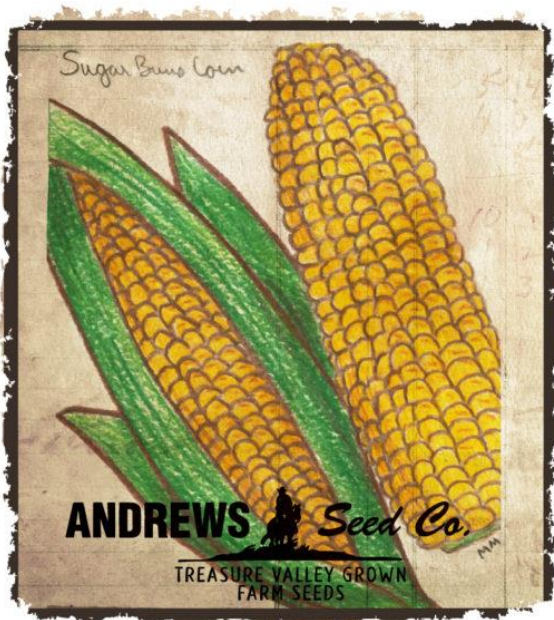


SUGAR BUNS

Sweet Corn

A sugar enhanced (se+) variety with the longest harvest period of all early corn varieties. Remains tender for up to two weeks in the field for the longest harvest period of all early corn varieties. The 7", 14-row ears have relatively narrow, deep kernels, making a nice package. Best at latitude 38° and higher.

VARIETY INFO

Botanical Name: *Zea mays* 'Sugar Buns'

Plant Dimensions: 6 - 7 Feet.

Days to Maturity: 72

Zone: 3-9

SOWING INFO

Sow Outside: Sow 3/4–1" deep, 6–7" apart (or 2 seeds every 9", thinning to 1 plant), rows 30–36" apart. Arrange in blocks of at least 4 rows for proper pollination, which is needed for well-filled ears. Successive plantings can be made through early summer; most growers prefer to extend the sweet corn season by planting a few varieties of different maturities.

Start Inside: Not Recommended.

Days to Emerge: 7–14 days

Seed Depth: 1–2"

Seed Spacing: 10 - 12"

Row Spacing: 30-36"

Thinning: Not required.

GROWING INFO

Harvesting: Harvest two weeks after the tassels have withered and the ears are plump. Check for ripeness by pulling back the husk at the tassel end and pressing a fingernail against a kernel. If milky liquid spurts out, the corn is ripe and ready to eat.

Fruit: 8- to 9-in. ears with 14-16 rows of creamy kernels.
