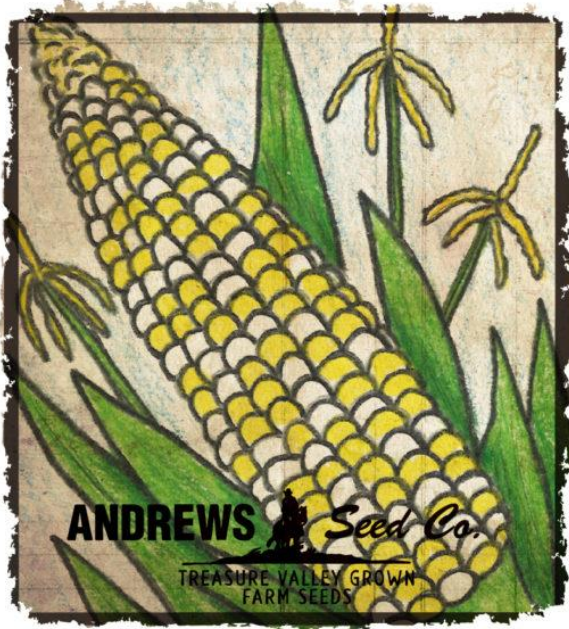


# SWEETNESS

## Sweet Corn

With the ears sitting on 5- and 1/2-foot stocks, this delicious bi-color sweet corn arrives in a protective husk and produces ears that average about 8" long with solid tip fill. 68 days to maturity.



## NOTES

### VARIETY INFO

**Botanical Name:** *Zea mays* "Sweetness"

**Plant Dimensions:** 6 and 8 feet tall

**Days to Maturity:** 65 - 90

**Zone:** 4-8

### SOWING INFO

**Sow Outside:** Plant about two weeks after the last spring frost date when the soil has warmed to at least 50 degrees Fahrenheit. Sweet corn planting depth is about 1 1/2 to 2 inches deep into moist, heavy soils. In dry, sandy soils, sow seeds 2 to 2-1/2 inches deep.

**Start Inside:** Not recommended.

**Days to Emerge:** 7-10 days.

**Seed Depth:** 1-2"

**Seed Spacing:** 8-10"

**Row Spacing:**

**Thinning:** Not required.

### GROWING INFO

**Harvesting:** Harvest when tassels begin to turn brown and cobs start to swell. Kernels should be full and milky. Pull ears downward and twist to take off stalk. Sugary (su) varieties begin to lose their sweetness soon after harvesting, so use them as soon as possible.

**Fruit:** 8" ears.
