## YELLOW HULLESS POPCORN

Corn

Exceptionally good eating popcorn with minimum of hull. A very old variety of popcorn that has not lost its appeal to home gardeners. It is quite dwarf in habit with plants only reaching about five feet in height. Each stalk produces two to three ears that are short and thick, about four inches in length and two inches in diameter. Kernels are arranged irregularly on cob and are unusually tender, sweet, and pure white when popped.

## **SOWING INFO**

**Sow Outside:** Plant seeds about two weeks after the last spring frost date when the soil has warmed to at least 50 degrees Fahrenheit. Sweet corn planting depth is about 1 1/2 to 2 inches deep into moist, heavy soils. In dry, sandy soils, sow seeds 2 to 2-1/2 inches deep.

Start Inside: No Recommended.

Seed Depth: 1-2"
Seed Spacing: 4"
Row Spacing: 30"

Thinning: Not necessary

## **GROWING INFO**

Harvesting: Leaving the corn on its stalks to completely dry in the field gives the best results; when they are ready to harvest, the stalk and the ears will be completely brown with no green coloring at all. However, since continued rainy weather and humidity compromise the quality of the ears, it may be necessary to continue drying them inside. Choose a dry location with moderate heat, but out of direct sunlight; hang the stalks upside down, or lay them out flat.
